OUR 5 PROGRAMS

Emergency Shelter

Overnight family room, warm dinner, and compassionate hospitality to stabilize families from immediate survival focus. Rotating congregational model.

Case Management

Primary case management from professional FHN staff, partnering with 20+ agencies, to provide guidance and access to full range of stabilizing services.

Day Center

Full-service, home-like setting for guest & wait-list families, allowing for multi-processing of activities of daily living including showers, laundry, kitchen, naps, computers, play space, etc.

Bridge Housing

(Sherwood House) Graduated independent living units with shared spaces for families with higher barriers to sustainable self-sufficiency.

Housing Programs

Move in support with continued case management guidance to maintain housing, preventing future episodes of homelessness.
